Sex Work and Law - Sans Justice

In India we have few legal provisions around prevention of trafficking and punishment for culprits as well as for rescue and rehabilitation. ITPA considered sex workers as victims as well as culprits at the same time. All the legal provisions against sex workers are based on moralistic grounds and are abolitionists in their approach. The entire debate around choice & consent creates a divide among feminist activists and sex worker's rights-based organizations in the world.
